RULES AND REGULATIONS

Attendance and Leave of Absence

- 1. Although the University prescribes a minimum of attendance to permit a student to sit for the University Examination, the college insists on regular attendance.
- 2. Only those who have a minimum of 75% attendance of the number of working days are eligible to appear for the Semester Examination. Candidates who have less than 75% of attendance but above 65% shall pay Rs. 125/- towards Condonation Fee. Those students who have less than 65% of attendance will have to repeat the semester, after completing the course.
- 3. Attendance shall be marked at the beginning of every period.
- 4. A student who is not in the class when the attendance is taken shall be marked as absent.
- 5. No student will be allowed to absent herself from the College without leave letter. She must apply for leave in advance stating explicitly the reason for absence.
- 6. Students should submit their leave applications to the Principal in the prescribed leave form duly countersigned by the parent or guardian in the case of Day Scholars and by the Warden of the Hostel in the case of Residential outside hostel Students.
- 7. In case of absence due to unforeseen circumstances and illness, leave letters can be submitted through messengers on the day of

- absence or the day of the student's return to the college. Otherwise leave will not be sanctioned.
- 8. Students should return on the re-opening day after the holidays. Serious action will be taken for absence on such days.
- Students absenting themselves without prior permission from classes/practical sessions, NCC / NSS / Physical Education/ JACEP will be heavily fined.
- 10. If a student absents herself continuously for three days without information, her name will be removed from the roll. If she is to be re-admitted she has to pay the re-admission fee of Rs. 5/-. In case of absence for a period more than five days on health grounds, the student must produce a Medical Certificate from a qualified Medical Practitioner on the day she attends the College.
- 11. All Scholarship/fee concession holders should have 90% of attendance, failing of which, the entire scholarship fee concession amount has to be refunded to the government as per the government rule.

Code of Conduct

- 1. Students are expected to conduct themselves within and outside the college in accordance with the best standard, manners and behaviours.
- Students are expected to dress themselves modestly and neatly.
 Students are not allowed to wear Leggings. They have to pin their shawl properly. All should wear Uniform Sarees on every

- Wednesday & Uniform Chudithar on every Saturdays. If the rule is violated, the student will be fined.
- 3. Students should be refined in behaviour. They must show due respect to the authorities, the Principal and the Staff and should greet them on the occasion of their first meeting for the day. Disobedience and rude behaviour of any kind will be severely dealt with.
- 4. Students should avoid doing anything by word or deed that may disturb the unity and harmony of the College.
- 5. Students are expected to maintain the premises of the College tidy, clean and healthy and abstain from disfiguring the walls, desks or benches by sticking notices or scribbling and other similar un civic acts.
- 6. Students are expected to read all the notices put up on the College and Department notice boards for important information.
- 7. Students are prohibited from organizing or attending any meeting in the college or collecting money for any purpose without the written sanction of the Principal. Strike and similar demonstrations are not allowed. But a respectful representation of grievances will be looked into with concern.
- 8. No student shall be allowed to leave the class room, without the permission of the teacher. Students should avoid going to the canteen, walking on the corridors and college campus during working hours. Students are given 10 minutes break between first and second period.

- 9. Cell phones and Cameras are strictly prohibited for students usage in hostels and on campus.
- 10. Students should wear the Identity Cards issued by the College everyday. They are expected to retain the I.D. Cards till the Transfer Certificate is issued.
- 11. At the stroke of the first bell, students should occupy their seats in the class and get ready for their class.
- 12. When a teacher enters the Classroom, students must stand and greet her. Likewise students should stand when the teacher leaves the class.
- 13. Students are expected to converse in English during the college hours.
- 14. Students are expected to approach the Staff Advisor for guidance, clarification and advice on matters pertaining to their studies.
- 15. Books, Magazines or Literature not conducive to good and healthy education should not be brought to the college.
- 16. Students are expected to walk silently and in an orderly manner while moving from one room to another.
- 17. Students entering the college after the assembly/prayer will present themselves to the Vice-Principals and then sign in the Late Register.
- 18. Students should maintain decorum and dignity while attending meetings and functions.
- 19. Disciplinary action will be taken against students involving in any kind of malpractices (cheating, copying in tests and examinations, giving false declaration etc.) in the campus or anywhere else.

- Ragging of any sort, inside the College/Hostel Campus is strictly forbidden.
- 20. With regard to all matters of conduct in and out of the College, students are expected to conduct themselves in such a way, as to maintain the prestige and reputation of the College.
- 21. Under the Education Rules of the Government, Principal has full power to inflict the following punishments; fine, loss of term days, certificate suspension and expulsion from the College.

Library Rules

- 1. The Library is open to all the members of the College.
- 2. It remains open from 8:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on all working days.
- 3. The Library remains closed on Sundays and other government holidays.
- 4. The Library issues 2 Library Cards to each UG student, 3 to each PG student, 4 to each M.Phil. student and 5 to each research scholars. Only one book can be borrowed on each card. While borrowing a book, the student should submit the card to the Librarian and should get it back when returning the book.
- 5. Books are usually lent for a period of two weeks. Books may be renewed twice, for a further period of one week, if there is no due.
- 6. The Librarian may ask for the return of any book even before the expiry of the normal loan period.
- 7. An over-due fine of 1 Rupee per day is collected for books returned after the due date.

- 8. Sub-lending of library books are strictly forbidden.
- 9. Library cards are not transferable.
- 10. Students are allowed to keep the library books during Semester and Christmas holidays. They should return the books immediately after their Semester Examination.
- 11. Personal belongings such as bags, Tiffin boxes and other books should not be taken inside the Library.
- 12. Books are to be returned from 12:15 to 1:00 p.m. and borrowed from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on all working days.
- 13. Reference books will not be lent. They can use the reprographic facility for the reference books.
- 14. Students are strictly forbidden either to underline or mark on the library books. Folding the corners of pages is not allowed.
- 15. If a book is damaged or lost, the person responsible for it shall supply a new copy of the book or pay the cost of the book if it is approved by the Librarian.
- 16. Students are advised to examine the condition of the book at the time of borrowing itself. If there is any damage, it should be immediately brought to the notice of the Librarian. Otherwise the borrower will be held responsible for the damage
- 17. A student who discontinues her study in the course of the year should surrender her cards and get a "no due chit" from the Librarian.
- 18. All students must return their cards at the end of their course.
- 19. Strict silence should be observed in the Library.

- 20. Economically weaker students from each department can borrow books from the Book Bank for the whole semester, recommended by the H.O.D. and permitted by the Principal. They should return all the books immediately after their semester examinations.
- 21. Staff & Students should wear their I.D. when they are in the library. Do not use others I.D. card and do not lend their I.D. card.
- 22. Students should drop their valuable suggestion and appreciation in the suggestion box.

Course Pattern

Diploma Course consists of 2 Semesters.

Each UG Course consists of 6 Semesters.

Each PG Course consists of 4 Semesters.

Each M.Phil. Course consists of 2 Semesters.

Each Ph.D. Course consists of 2 - 4 years (with M.Phil.,)

Each Ph.D. Course consists of 3 - 5 years (without M.Phil)

Core Courses

A core course is either major core or allied core, totally related to major subject. The core elective course is offered by the parent department. The objective is to provide choice and flexibility within the Department. A student can choose her elective paper subject to the choice of majority. Elective is related to the major subject. The difference between Core Course and Elective Course is that there is choice for the student in the Elective Course. Every department offers three core electives in three different semesters (IV, V & VI).

Self Study Papers

The self-study courses are offered by the parent department in addition to the regular papers to enable the advanced learners to earn extra credits. The students appear for the semester examinations on Self Study Papers on their own efforts without undergoing any regular classes, but the Syllabus and Course Materials are supplied by the department concerned. It has only external examination for 100 marks.

Non Major Elective

It is an inter-departmental course. A student should take at least two electives offered by the departments other than the parent department in third and fourth semesters. Out of these, one elective in III semester should be from the Arts discipline for the students of Science discipline and vice versa. In IV semester the student from Arts

discipline can choose the elective from the Arts discipline other than the parent department for the students from Science discipline can choose the elective from Science discipline other than parent department. It has only CIA.

Skill Based Courses / Elective

The objective of introducing skill based courses / elective is to enable the students to pursue specific skills by selecting the skill oriented papers offered by parent departments or non-parent departments. This is introduced to make every course multi-disciplinary and the course pattern has in built mechanism to provide mobility and flexibility to choose skill oriented papers outside the parent department. Out of the four skill based courses, two courses on Computer Applications are offered in the third and fourth semesters to all UG students and they are mandatory. The UG Students are classified into four streams namely A, B, C, and D to impart computer education according to their diverse needs.

Stream A

Students of Computer Science

Stream B

Students of Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics

Stream C

Students of Commerce, BBA, and B.Com with (CA)

Stream D

Students of Tamil, English, History and Zoology

The Skill Based Elective offered in the V Semester is designed for the students of non-parent departments and skill based course offered in VI semester is designed exclusively for parent department students. The Skill Based Courses / Electives have Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) only.

Value Education

This course is offered in the first semester of UG Degree Program.

Environmental Studies

A paper on Environmental Studies is offered to all the first year UG Students in the second semester.

* NME, SBE, VE & EVS have only CIA

Extension Activities (JACEP)

It is an outreach program which aims at creation of social awareness among students, promotion of Women Empowerment and contribution to community development. A UG student has to put in 70 hours of field work compulsorily outside the regular college working hours.

NSS / NCC / P.Ed.

It has 120 hours of Field Work / Parade / Games every year and totally the student should complete 240 hours in two years.

Evaluation Procedures

There are two components in the evaluation and assessment of a student, namely, Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and Semester Examinations. The Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) carries 40 Marks and Semester Examination carries 60 marks.

Regulations for CIA

- 1. CIA tests are conducted twice a semester with two hours duration.
- 2. Two tests (Mid semester and End Semester) are conducted centrally and the average is taken as the test mark.
- 3. There is no provision for retest in CIA. Incase a student is absent for genuine reasons, another test may be conducted at the discretion of the Principal.
- 4. A student who could not get the minimum pass marks in the aggregate of CIA and Semester Exams due to very low marks in CIA, shall be given just one chance to take up CIA improvement Exam, provided the student must have appeared twice for the External Exams in the particular paper and failed during the course of her study.
 - 5. CIA improvement is allowed with in two academic years after the completion of the course.

Regulations for Semester Examinations

• The Semester Examinations are held at the end of each semester with 3 hours duration.

- o 75% attendance is necessary to appear for the examinations.
- o Revaluation of U.G. answer scripts are permissible.
- UG student is expected to clear all her arrears within 6 years from the year of her admission to the course.
- o PG student is expected to clear all her arrears within 5 years from the year of her admission to the course.
- Passing Minimum: A student shall be declared to have passed if she secures in

UG

- 40% and above in the Semester Examination and 40% and above in the aggregate of CIA and Semester Examination in each paper.
- Earns a minimum of 140 Credits

PG

- o 50% and above in the Semester Examination and 50% and above in the aggregate of CIA and Semester Examination in each paper.
- o Earns a minimum of 90 Credits.

Practical Examinations

- All the Science students in the UG and PG courses take practical examinations (Including Computer Application) at the end of each semester.
- Examinations for arrears in practicals are conducted during the practical examinations of respective semesters only.

Project Work

O The external examiners appointed by the Controller of Examinations and the guide jointly evaluate the projects; conduct the Viva-Voce and award marks.

Supplementary Examinations

o It is conducted two weeks after the date of publication of even semester examination results. The students who have passed all examinations from semester I to V (I to III in PG) but have arrears only in the VI semester (IV in PG) are eligible to appear for the supplementary examination. If any student is absent for the examination she can't appear for (or) write the supplementary examination.

Certificates

- O Students should apply well in advance for any type of Certificates. They should apply at least two days before they wish to receive the same.
- Age Certificates and Identification Certificates are issued at a charge of Rs. 2/- each.
- A Search Fee of Rs. 5/- shall be charged extra from those who have been out of the College for more than two years.

Extra Curricular Activities

All the students shall be the members of the College Union and other affiliated Associations. Opportunities shall be provided by the associations to all the students to develop their talents.

Medical Inspection

Every student will have Medical Inspection conducted by the College Medical Officer.

Fee

- The fee shall be paid in-one installment in each semester within due date.
- Students who withdraw from the College in the course of the year, are required to pay all the dues regarding the tuition fee and other fees, up to the date of withdrawal.
- The fee once remitted will not be refunded if the student fails to join the college or discontinues.
- A fine of Rs.10/- per working day will be charged for late payment.
