The successful activities distinguished Saree Screen Printing Training on 19.10.2016 to 25.10.2016 sponsored by Rural Self Employment Training Centre, Theni.

Under the Departments of Ministry of Textiles, Govt. of India, 510 Artisans have received Identity Cards for three crafts viz Zari and Zari goods, Embroidery and Pottery and Clay objects in Periyakulam Taluk.

St. Anne's Vocational Training Centre is registered and approved as Training Provider under Tamil Nadu Skill Development Corporation, Guindy, and Chennai for imparting skill training in the following modules like Zardosi Work, Hand Embroider, Tailor, Garment Construction Techniques, Book Binder and Supervisor Book Binding.

73 girls have been trained intensively in type writing in Tamil, and English, in lower and upper grades. 25 girls passed successfully with distinction and given the Department of Technical Education, Chennai certificates.
